Final Result

SAT: 10 x 3 = 30 marks to be converted into 10 marks for Annual Result.

(Dividing factor 3)

For Example, if a student scores 28 marks out of 30 in all SAT Assessments. Then 28 marks will be divided by 3 = 28/3=9.33 round off to 9 marks which will

be taken in his/her final results towards SAT Assessment.

Half Yealy Assessment: 20 marks to be converted into 10 marks for Annual Result.

(Dividing factor 2)

For Example, if a student scores 16 marks out of 20 in Half Yearly Assessments. Then 16 marks will be divided by 2 = 16/2= 8 marks which will be taken in his/her final results towards Half Yearly Assessment.

Annual Assessment: 30 marks for Annual Result.

For Example, if a student scores 26 marks out of 30 in Annual Assessment. Then 26 marks will be taken in his/her final results towards Annual Assessment. There will be no factor to convert the marks of Annual Assessment.

Class Room Assessment (CRA)*:

CRA will have total 50 marks which include following components

Oral assignment = 15 Marks
Class Work Assessment = 15 Marks
Class room participation = 13 Marks
Exchange of text books = 2 Marks
Attendance = 5 Marks

For Example, if a student scores 45 marks out of 50 in all CRA Components. Then 45 marks will be taken in his/her final results towards CRA Assessment.

Note: CRA will be done at school level by concerned teacher and awards will be uploaded on AVSAR APP or as directed by directorate and its record will be maintained at school level.

Thus, for total 100 marks, 10 marks will come from all SATs, 10 marks will come from Half Yearly Assessment, 30 marks will come from Annual Assessment and 50 marks will come from CRA i.e. oral assignments, work done in class work assessment, classroom participation, exchange of text books and attendance.

*Criteria for CRA(Classes 1st and 2nd)

Oral assessment: Teacher will ask the questions orally to the student on the topic taught and record his/her performance. It will be recorded on monthly basis and then in the academic session taking average of monthly performance, marks will be provided on this component. There may be five criteria to record it as less than average, average, good, very good and excellent. For below average<5marks, averge:5 to 7 marks, good: 8 to 10 marks, very good: 11 to 13 marks, excellent-14 to 15 marks will be taken.

Class Work Assessment: Teacher will assign written work to the student on the topic taught and record his/her performance. It will be recorded on monthly basis and then in the academic session , taking average of monthly performance, marks will be provided on this component. There may be five criteria to record it as less than average, average, good, very good and excellent. For below average<5marks, averge:5 to 7 marks, good: 8 to 10 marks, very good: 11 to 13 marks, excellent-14 to 15 marks will be taken.

Class room participation: Teacher will observe the student that how much he/she shows enthusiasm in asking questions and interactive with peers on the topic taught and record his/her performance. It will be recorded on monthly basis and then in the academic session taking average of monthly performance, marks will be provided on this component. There may be five criteria to record it as less than average, average, good, very good and excellent. For below average<4marks, averge:4 to 6 marks, good: 7 to 9 marks, very good: 10 to 11 marks, excellent-12 to 13 marks will be taken.

Attendance: Teacher will keep record of attendance of students. To provide marks on this component, the criteria will be followed as: 1-20%=1mark, 20-40%=2marks, 40-60%=3marks, 60-80%=4marks and above 80%=5marks

Exchange of text books:Students who have exchanged 50% or more books will be given 2 marks and those who have exchanged less than 50% books will be given 1 mark.

(Dividing factor 3).

For example, if a student scores 52 mark out of 60 in all SATs. Then 52 will be divided by 3 = 52/3 = 17.3 round off to 17 marks which will be taken in his/her

final results towards SAT.

Half Yealy Assessment: 40 marks to be converted into 20 marks for Annual Result.

(Dividing factor 2)

For Example, if a student scores 18 marks out of 20 in Half Yearly Assessments. Then 18 marks will be divided by 2 = 18/2= 9 marks which will be taken in his/her final results towards Half Yearly Assessment.

Annual Assessment: 80 marks to be converted into 40 marks for Annual Result.

(Dividing factor 2)

For Example, if a student scores 76 marks out of 80 in Annual Assessment. Then 76 will be divided by 2 = 76/2= 38 marks which will be taken in his/her final results towards Annual Assessment.

Class Room Assessment (CRA)*:

CRA will have total 20 marks which include following components:

Survey/Quiz = 05 Marks
Class Work Assessment = 04 Marks
Class room participation = 04 Marks
Exchange of Text Books = 02 Marks
Attendance = 05 Marks

For Example, if a student scores 15 marks out of 20 in all CRA Components. Then 15 marks will be taken in his/her final results towards CRA Assessment.

Note: CRA will be done at school level by concerned teacher and awards will be uploaded on AVSAR APP or as directed by directorate and its record will be maintained at school level.

Thus, for total 100 marks, 20 marks will come from all SATs, 20 marks will come from Half Yearly Assessment, 40 marks will come from Annual Assessment and 20 marks will come from CRA i.e. survey/quiz participation, work done in class work assessment, classroom participation, exchange of books and attendance.

*Criteria for CRA(Classes 3rd to 8th)

Class Work Assessment: Teacher will assign written work to the student on the topic taught and record his/her performance. It will be recorded on monthly basis and then in the academic session , taking average of monthly performance, marks will be provided on this component. There may be four criteria to record it as less than average, average, good, excellent. For <average=1mark, averge-2marks, good-3marks, excellent-4 marks will be taken.

Class room participation: Teacher will observe the student that how much he/she shows enthusiasm in asking questions and interactive with peers on the topic taught and record his/her performance. It will be recorded on monthly basis and then in the academic session taking average of monthly performance, marks will be provided on this component. There may be four criteria to record it as less than average, average, good, excellent. For <average=1marks, averge-2marks, good-3marks, excellent-4 marks will be taken.

Attendance: Teacher will keep record of attendance of students. To provide marks on this component, the criteria will be followed as: 1-20%=1mark, 20-40%=2marks, 40-60%=3marks, 60-80%=4marks and above 80%=5marks

Survey/Quiz: Teacher will keep record of student that he/she is participating in survey/quiz conducted by the department and his/her performance on this component on monthly basis and then in the academic session taking average of monthly performance and participation, marks will be provided on this component. There may be four criteria to record it as less than average, average, good, excellent. For average=2marks, averge=3marks, good-4marks, excellent-5 marks will be taken.

Exchange of text books: Students who have exchanged 50% or more books will be given 2 marks and those who have exchanged less than 50% books will be given 1 mark.
